Hi everyone!

One thing that has been encouraging to me (among many!) has been the nice turnouts for worship service, and the numbers of people coming:-) Way to go, church, on inviting people and spreading the word!

I want to write this month about something to possibly stimulate some "thinking outside the box" creative ideas. I read a little article this week that talked about thinking of other "entry points" to church in addition to Sunday worship (an "entry point" being, the place or way new people first start to connect with the church). Now, we have some of these already, like Food Bank, Kids Club, pre-school, etc.

Here's the "outside the box" part - How can we more *engage* the people (or their families) who come to these church "entry points" such that they "come to see the church as an additional place of connection and belonging?" And/or, such that they start having opportunities to come into contact with, and begin to engage, the Christian faith and Jesus Christ?:-)

I'm asking you guys to be thinking about it - How can we help some of these people start to feel actually "connected" at our church, or "belonging" at our church? And/or, how can we help them begin to engage the Christian faith?

Here's an example - of my brainstorming on these things - What if we offered a Christmastime/Advent video study specifically for and specifically inviting the unchurched parents or families of those attending Kids Club, the pre-school and/or the Food Bank? Is

that a crazy idea? It would be targeted for these folks, designed for these folks, and made up of these folks. (Or, for a different option, we could specifically invite some of these folks to join in on an Advent group already planned for current church folk).

The article I read mentioned mission ministries (inviting some of these folks to participate in a local mission project with our churchmembers), other small group opportunities, "affinity group" opportunities (parenting, scrapbooking, yoga, personal finance classes - what are the community needs? and then creating a group to meet one of those needs), and also doing something to engage people with web, social media, and other digital opportunities.

So, I'm asking you guys to be brainstorming - How can we start to "connect" newcomers to our church, besides through our worship service? Keep inviting folks to worship, absolutely! You're doing great! God is blessing! And also, think about other "entry points" to the church, and how we can engage people with our wonderful church and our wonderful God!


