### THE OFFENSE JESUS BRINGS (JOHN 6:53-69)

In 2014, a man opened fire with a handgun during a meeting with his caseworker and psychiatrist at a hospital. Sadly, the caseworker was mortally wounded, while the psychiatrist—who returned fire with his own handgun—received minor injuries. The gunman, who was subdued at the scene, indicated that he opened fire because he'd been offended by the hospital's "no guns" policy.

Jesus once offended a crowd of disciples with some difficult words (John 6:61). Many of His followers "turned away and deserted him" (v.66). What caused them to bail? Jesus stated that only those who would "eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood" would receive eternal life (v.53). Perhaps stunned by His cannibalistic-sounding words or upset that Jesus wasn't going to be the militant, conquering Messiah they had expected or unwilling to surrender completely to Him, they turned away.

Jesus, of course, wasn't speaking of literal flesh and blood. He was simply exposing the deserters' lack of faith and their unwillingness to accept His life and ways as their own (v.64). As He watched the doubting disciples walk away, He "turned to the Twelve and asked, 'Are you also going to leave?'" (v.67).

That's a question we must all answer: *Will we turn away from Jesus when His words and truth offend others? Will we deny His teachings to avoid conflict, pain, or embarrassment?* 

Peter replied, "To whom would we go?" (v.68). Jesus is the true Son of God who alone provides eternal life.

Some people, like the deranged gunman, will take offense for the wrong reasons. But as God helps us lovingly present the claims of our faith, it will allow the message to be the point—not us or the way we share it. —Tom Felten (GodTube June 21)

Kelvin says that he is really appreciating for the support you have continually given to him. He says that he has received a gift recently and they bought a goat.


\_ Kelvin says that he has been promoted to grade six this year and he says that he is working very hard and request for your prayer.

## Great Plains Annual Conference Report by Betty Buell

The Great Plains Annual Conference met in Wichita, Kansas, at the Century II Convention Hall, June 10-13, 2015. Mary Lou Hinz and I attended this conference. I, as MLUMC Lay delegate, and Mary Lou as guest, confidant and advisor.

The meeting began on Weds. morning with separate Lay and Clergy sessions. The 29 Lay candidates for delegation to the General Conference and Jurisdictional Conference spoke at the meeting and other Lay reports were given.

There being no way to thoroughly cover all the four day events of this conference, I have chosen to use a "bullet format" in no special order of importance or revelance in my report.

~Bishop Scott Jones gave the opening worship sermon on unity and Spirit-led discipling. A highlight of this service was the baptism of the baby daughter of Rev. Emily and Stephen Cannon of Nebraska.

 $\sim$  33 young Christian interns are working in 20 churches this summer. This involves 10 weeks of service in the Great Plains Conference in various ministries.

~Bridges to the Future Campaign was a great success. The program raised more than \$8.7 million to help expand Hispanic ministry, build and renovate buildings for campus ministry, start new churches and improve UMC camps. MLUMC pledged \$1000 for five years during that campaign.

~Great Plains UMC has given \$623,000 to Imagine No Malaria.

~UMMen celebrated its 26th year of awarding scholarships to students who are pursuing degrees in Christian leadership and related fields.

~Great Plains UMWomen gave over \$800,000 to missions in 2014. Only one national conference gave more.

~MLUMWomen prepared 12 birthing kits for the UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) ingathering at the conference. A huge UMCOR truck was at the loading dock taking various donations and it was about half full on Thursday morning!

~Five UMChurches in the Great Plains Conference celebrated 150th Anniversaries.

~Seven UMChurches in the Conference closed in 2014, with one re-opening as the New Beginnings Church in Wichita. The majority of the church closings were ones established in the late 1800's or early 1900's when they were organized for close accessibility, many had under 20 in their congregations at this time.

~New Church Development reported the continuing support of the nine existing new churches in the Great Plains Conference. They also announced a strategic plan for "20 New Churches by 2020" involving a three-tiered process.

~24 churches received grants to help build and strengthen partnerships between churches and schools throughout Kansas and Nebraska. About 177 churches have made partnerships with local public schools but many more are needed.

~UMCOR's giving in 2014 was \$8,939,720 and has been there for not only disaster relief but assistance and leadership for long-term recovery. UMCOR has been in existence for 75 years!

~One Great Hour of Sharing Sunday's in local churches support the staff and administration costs of UMCOR so that all donations to disasters and recovery will be 100%.

~Great Plains Conference ordained seven elders, commissioned twelve provisional elders, one provisional deacon and one associate member during this year's conference.

During the business sessions, there were 21 Resolutions and 7 Petitions presented, sometimes debated and voted on. The delegate voting process elected six Clergy and six Lay delegates to the 2016 General Conference, six Clergy and six Lay delegates to the Jurisdictional Conference plus three alternates each. This process was done by hand held voting machines and was a VERY lengthy process. As always, this Conference was not without controversial issues and decisions. Please contact me if you have any questions about the Conference and I will be happy to provide materials that address these issues and decisions.

Thanks to anyone who reads this entire report, it is an obligation I assume as the delegate and it is truly the only painful part for me! I considered it an honor to be the Lay Delegate to the United Methodist Annual Conference.

What diff rence does it make to you That Christian is your name? If it really doesn't matter Playing church is just a game


The second question's similar Can be hard as a rock When talking 'bout the "E" word It's the key that turns the lock
